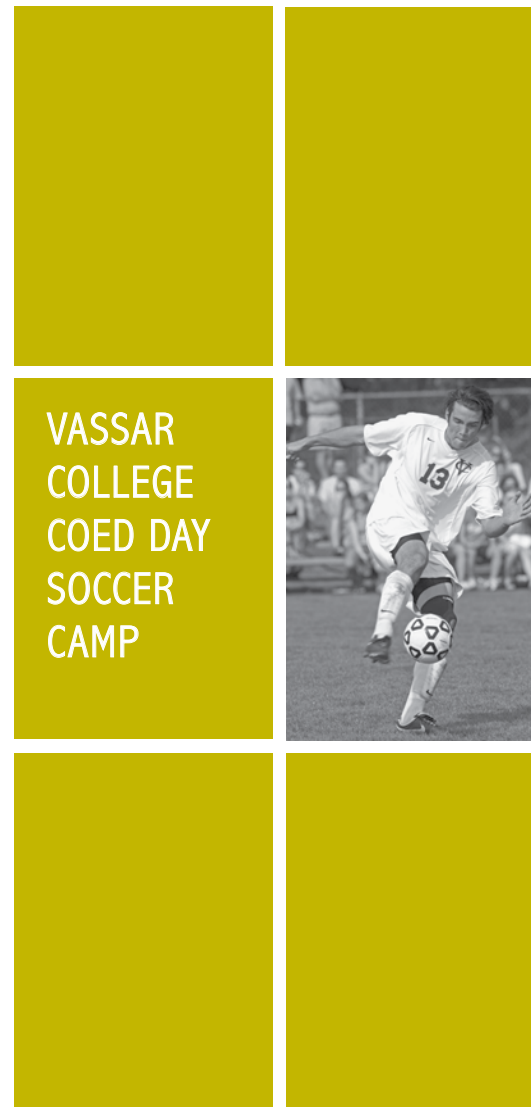

Important Information

Only campers in the REGULAR CAMP will get an age-appropriately sized ball. All children 11 and under will get a size 4 and all children aged 12 will get a size 5. No balls will be provided for the Advanced Camp, but campers are expected to bring their own ball.

Outdoor soccer shoes and shinguards are required. Shoes are required for indoor play and it is advisable for campers to bring a spare shirt, shorts, socks, etc.

A medical examination by a school nurse or physician dated between July 13, 2009 and July 12, 2010 is mandatory for the Regular Camp and one dated between June 28, 2008 and July 2, 2010 is mandatory for the Advanced Camp. Both camps require an up-to-date immunization record.

Enrollment is only complete when remaining balance and all completed forms are received in our office, postmarked June 20, 2010 or earlier.

A FREE full lunch in the air-conditioned All College Dining Center is an integral part of the program, and all campers are expected to participate.

Written cancellation requests from parents/guardians received prior to June 20, 2010 will be refunded, minus the deposit. No refunds will be issued for early withdrawals or absences after June 22, except for medical reasons documented by a physician. In such cases a refund (balance less 30%) will be made.

Camp Coaches

Andy Jennings, the 2009 Liberty League Coach of the Year, is the winningest soccer coach in Vassar history, has compiled a 153-111-29 record in 18 seasons. A native of England, Jennings played semi-professionally there and represented England Universities. He is a qualified Football Association coach and has worked extensively in youth soccer throughout the United States. He also served as Athletic Director at Vassar College from 1990 to 2004. Jennings has a master's degree from the College of William and Mary and a PhD in Sport Psychology from the University of Maryland.

Nate Gibboney, a graduate of Susquehanna University (where he was a four-year starter, captain his junior and senior years, team defensive player of the year, and named All-Middle Atlantic Conference), just completed his second year as Vassar assistant men's soccer coach. His previous coaching experience includes a stint at Westminster College, where he helped them to a President's Athletic Conference championship in 2006 and an eventual ECAC tournament appearance. Gibboney has a master's degree from Westminster and both his NSCAA regional and advanced regional coaching licenses.

Other camp staff includes a mixture of qualified coaches and current Vassar players who are adept at coaching the more experienced younger player while encouraging the less skilled player to succeed.

Facilities

Superb natural grass fields, a large indoor facility, artificial turf field when needed, and a cool pool (regular camp only) are available for camp use. Vassar vans will take the campers to and from the various sites.

Camp Philosophies

The Vassar College Regular Soccer Camp is for boys and girls between the ages of 7 and 12. Players of beginning and intermediate abilities are welcome and will be placed in instructional groups according to age, ability, and wishes.

The camp prides itself on its creative and fun learning environment, one in which each camper is not only tested but enjoys the learning process.

Older, more experienced players are invited to attend the advanced camp, which is directed toward players with club travel team or regional select team experience. Instruction for improvement of technical skills continues, but significant attention is now placed on individual and team tactics, with emphasis placed on small-sided games and larger, age appropriate games in each coaching component. The camp has four main components:

- 1) technical skills;
- 2) special instruction sessions and opportunities to play Futsal;
- 3) indoor competition session; and
- 4) more advanced tactical strategies during afternoon outdoor play.

All campers are expected to bring their own ball to camp each day.
